> DAF is committed to conducting its business in a responsible way and has had an environmental policy in place for over 10 years. In 1998, DAF was one of the first truck manufacturers with an ISO 14001 certified environmental protection system. Since then EcoDesign has been the company's unique approach to environmentally responsible product design, and ensures all DAF products comply with the strictest environmental guidelines, from initial concept to end-of-life recycling.

The EcoDesign team is responsible for reducing the environmental impact during all three product life cycle phases; production, use and disposal. The team looks for solutions that are good for the environment as well as solutions to improve vehicle efficiency. More than 85 per cent of a DAF truck can be re-used once the truck has reached the end of its working life. 90 per cent of metal parts are re-usable and 80 per cent of plastic parts.

All plastic parts used to produce DAF trucks are issued with a separate material code to identify the exact plastic type, and DAF provides recycling guides for each model in which all components are colour coded by material type.

It takes engineering excellence and 80 years of experience to build a truck as good as a DAF. The constant drive to engineer and manufacture the highest quality transport solutions has become a trademark for the company, and delivering the perfect working environment to all drivers is the cornerstone of DAF's success.

DAF recently launched a new series of driver and environment friendly trucks ranging from LF45 street sweepers to CF85 460hp prime movers.

In addition to new interior and exterior features, all 2008 models in Australia now incorporate the latest Euro 4 engines which boast enhanced performance, improved fuel economy and are emission compliant up to 2010. The next level of emission standards, Euro 5, has also been met by the quiet PACCAR engines.
